16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

National Education Policy thrives on the prospect of liberal education that sensitizes and enables students to the fundamentally crosslinked nature of all human knowledge and inner inquisition. To cater to the needs of thousands of students across the nation, NEP-2020 expects that all the country's higher education institutions shall be multidisciplinary by 2030 by setting up Multidisciplinary Education and Research Universities. NEP 2020 has rightly pointed out about the needs to develop the Academic Bank of Credit, so that the students have complete freedom for entry and exit during the chosen programme to any institution all over the country by lateral transfer of his or her Credit on their account. Moreover, NEP also accepted the right if the learners to pursue joint degrees between two Higher Education Institutions at the National as well as International Level. Balurghat College being an affiliated college to University of GourBanga has no autonomy to Create Academic Bank of Credit in true sense at the college level. Only PG departments (Sanskrit, Bengali and History) has autonomy and can create academic bank of credit. However, with this objective Choice Based Credit System of academic programmes were completely adopted by the affiliating university from the academic session

2019-2020 and the syllabus of every programme had been thoroughly revised clearly mentioning the credit associated at every subjects in line with the UGC guidelines. The marks sheet provided to the students clearly depicts the credit earned by the student in the particular semester. The teachers also maintain the percentage of students in each subject separately and internal evaluation examinations are regularly conducted throughout the session so that the information regarding the credit earned by the students during and completion of each semester may be provided to the university before commencement of each semester examination. The University assembles all the records regarding the Credit due to each student separately. Balurghat College is preparing a outline to register all its students in Digilocker, and provide all the students ABC ID by next academic session.

17.Skill development:

Various Skill development programmes are undertaken by departments of the college. Dept of Sanskrit organises Sanskrit speaking courses. Dept of Geography and NSS unit has organised skill development workshop on sustainable development, Swachhata and sustainability in the campus. Students were given hands on training and awareness lectures on environmental effects, and importance of climate change during Environmental week by Dept of Geography. Dept of Zoology organised excursions and tree plantation drives. Main challenges faced in a college like Balurghat College is, majority of the students come from rural areas, and many of them are first generation learners. They do not have proper skills to make themselves presentable in the job market after graduation. Balurghat College has taken initiatives to develop soft-skills among the students via various classes and programmes organised by Dept of English, Dept of Commerce, Science depts. NCC unit etc. Mock teaching programme is also a major part of the skill development of students, and helped the students immensely in confidence building. Placement cell has already started work with various agencies and companies like TCS regarding long term training programme in soft skills which will make the students employable. College is planning to organise certificate/add on courses on various skill development approach that will integrate the curriculum with employability.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Balurghat College is well aware about the value of Indian knowledge system in the education and upbringing process of a student, and ready to accept these aspects of NEP 2020 as the same is very much part of Institutional Culture. Sanskrit and Bengali, two integral

part of Indian culture and language, have PG departments along with UG departments. Each year on an average more than 130 students are enrolled in each of these departments in Hons and PG. If we consider general stream, these numbers go well beyond 1000 in each year. Also, in the CBCS curriculum, Modern Indian Language is a compulsory course all students have to choose. Sanskrit department of our college organises lecture series, spoken Sanskrit course, celebrates Sanskrit week, and motivates students to learn Sanskrit as a language of communication. Department of Bengali also organises various lectures, seminars to integrate the knowledge in the language in a student's academic journey, and also familiarises students with the evolution of the language Bengali over the years. Eminent academicians from Bangladesh also come to Balurghat College during seminars and lectures, and faculty members of the college publishes several books in Bengali that highlight the importance of the language in our lives.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

NEP 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century and replaces the thirty-four year old National Policy on Education (NPE), 1986. This policy aims to transform India into a vibrant knowledge society making both school and college education more holistic, flexible, multidisciplinary, suited to 21st century needs and aimed at bringing out the unique capabilities of each student. It aims to provide multi-disciplinary holistic education at the undergraduate level for integrated, rigorous exposure to science, arts, humanities, mathematics and professional fields having imaginative and flexible curricular structures, creative combinations of study, integration of vocational education and multiple entry/exit points. Balurghat College is prepared to accept this flexible curricular structure, and has the infrastructure to accommodate multiple entry exit point of the students. It is an affiliated college to University of GourBanga, so the student registration process for the examinations in CBCS system is dependent on University of GourBanga. The education is outcome based, and emphasis is given on the learning outcomes of the students at the exit points. Innovative methods of teaching learning are practised by the teachers right from the first semester, so that a student can achieve the learning outcomes at any point of exit during the curriculum. Programme outcomes, Programme specific outcomes, and course outcomes are clearly stated in all the departments, and students are always encouraged to follow the guidelines regarding achieving POs, PSOs, and COs. Infrastructure facilities like computational lab, equipped science laboratories, smart class rooms, GIS, automated library enhances the focus on

outcome based education in Balurghat College.

20.Distance education/online education:

Balurghat College has two study centers in its campus for Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) and Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU). Thousands of students enroll every year in various course in these study centers and therefor cater needs of many students through distance education over last 20+ years. Separate coordinator for both he Open University study centers are chosen from faculty members of the Balurghat college, and they along with center-in-charge, ensures smooth and robust distance education system. Online education has also been a part of teaching curriculum for Balurghat College faculty members for last 3 years. Additional classes, remedial classess, doubt-clearing sessions, mentoring sessions are organised in regular intervals during academic year via Google Meet, ZOOM, Microsoft Team platforms. In future several distance o education courses, and online courses , especially in vocational area, and skill development area would be offered by Balurghat College. Commmerce department is also preparing to offer online courses and certificate courses in finance and banking sector which will create awareness among the students in the job market of finance and banking sector. Dept of Bengali, Chemistry, Sanskrit also conducts online classes for students, and some of the literature based performance avtivities are also taught online.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The curriculum is set by University of GourBanga. The institute has designed a well planned master routine keeping into account the prescribed format of class distribution required for effective curriculum delivery. The ratio of honours and general courses has been managed according to the requirement of UGC curriculum. The standing committee on academic affairs meet regularly to formulate strategies for effective curriculum delivery, and action taken report is well documented in minutes of these meetings. Internal assessment would carry direct weightage in total marks in CBCS system for each paper. Student feedback system ensures the quality of the effectiveness in curriculum delivery, at the end of the academic year. Regularized class tests and laboratory tests has ensured proper delivery of the curriculum and preparedness of the students during academic session. ICT enabled teaching learning process has enhanced the quality and effectiveness of curriculum delivery. Use of various software, educational websites, and smart class room has enhanced the quality of curriculum content delivery. Proper and updated instruments as per requirement of the CBCS curriculum are provided to the students. Alongside student feedback, other modes of effective curriculum delivery is documented as completion of class loads as per routine, and well documented by IQAC. Experiential learning and project works are implemented as part of curriculum delivery to ensure outcome based teaching.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

After periodic evaluation of the first year (HONS) students, 2 months after their admission, two categories of students are found-advanced

and slow learners, depending on their basic knowledge and performance in these evaluations. As most of the students are first generation learners, College use to give special emphasis on their learning process and adaptability to the academic environment. To match up their compatibility different kinds of methods like mock teaching, remedial classes, group discussions, interactive practical sessions, advanced learning by systematic seminars etc. are organized. For example, in mock teaching the advanced learners are asked to convey lectures on some particular topics and the slow learners are asked to upgrade their knowledge via interactive session after completion of the lecture. College actively appreciate the advanced learners by providing them various reference books and encourage them to share their understanding and concepts with their classmates in the form of reverse classroom. To develop interest and confidence among students about the subject, quiz and group discussions are arranged choosing various topics from syllabus. E contents like ppt, flashcard, YouTube study videos and online animation are used to clear the doubts of the students whenever necessary. As most of the students come from Bengali medium schools, many of them face difficulties to follow English books and lectures. In remedial classes college try to provide study materials in Bengali to students so that they can quickly the concept.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Different department of Balurghat college arranges various student

centric programmes that enable students to develop self confidence and rectify their mistakes. There has been a paradigm shift in classroom teaching over last two years, and various Departments use outcome based teaching where they engage students in all research projects, application based assignments. Students are often given tasks correlating their knowledge to real life scenarios. Small research papers, or assignments are given in such a way so that the students has to collect information from newspapers, internet, and real life work environment.. Annual exhibition held regularly in the college premises and students are encouraged to perform different projectworks with socio-economical values and scientific outcomes. The topics were demonstrated by all the students using different charts, models and practical demonstration. Faculty members of various departments conduct debates and discussions where students are encouraged to come with different opinions and thoughts which pave the way of arguments as well as away of learning. In most of the classes topics are discussed briefly and problem solving methodology is used to check their understanding about the topic. In the practical classes the apparatus and instruments are used individually so that they can acquire the knowledge of handling these by themselves. The students regularly participate in the Youth Parliament Competitions . Various cultural and academic competitions are also organized by which the students get the scope of participative learning. Along with exhibition, some departments organize educational and industrial visit in the nearby areas. The students get the opportunity to have a hands-on learning experience from the experts of the field of manufacturing industries.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

College has multiple dedicated smart class rooms (one smart room including smart board), and a mini conference hall with ICT facilities. The college has 5 portable overhead projector and 2 built-in overhead projector in Smart room and dept of bengali. Faculty members use these ICT tools to teach various topics that need audio-visual demonstration for effective curriculum delivery.

All the departments have their individual whatsapp groups where communication is made regarding electronic version of studymaterials, including video lectures, links to project work, assignment etc. All the general students are also enrolled in official whatsapp and telegram groups via which effective communication is established and study materials are supplied regarding teaching-learning process. Each faculty member is assigned atleast one class per week in ICT enabled classrooms, and a logbook of ICT rooms attendance is maintained. Central library has inbuilt KOHA software system for digitised check-in, check out of books. Abou 50% of 30000+ books in library has been enlisted under digital automation.

Faculty members also use google classrooms for home assignments and tests. Most of the departments periodically conduct ICT skill training for their students, so that students are well equipped about various ICT based academic aids.

CBCS currucilum of University of GourBanga includes 20% of total

marks for internal assessment in each paper for laboratory based subjects, and 36% for non lab based subjects. All the departments has definite mechanism for continuous internal evaluation via class tests, unit tests, mock teaching, experiential learning like project work, field excursions, performance arts and display of creative ideas. Class tests are conducted atleast once for each paper during the semester in each course. Copies of class tests are evaluated and distributed among the students , and answers are discussed in doubt clearing classes. Tutorials are conducted after assessing advance and slow learners in each class. Assignments are given on topics that need special discussion and attention, and students are assessed in the tutorial class based on assignments and tests. Some departments and courses demand submission of project work, through which students are also evaluated. Attendance to classess constitute 40% of the assigned internal assessment for each paper. Minimum 75% of attendance are required for each student to be evaluated for each course/paper. Stress has been given on continuous internal evaluation process. Project work are given to the students which are integral part of internal evaluation process.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Balurghat College offers undergraduate programme in 20 subjects (16 hons) and PG programme in 3 subjects. PG division of Balurghat College is autonomous. The institute has adequate infrastructural facilities like 35 Classrooms, 18 laboratories, computer laboratories, departmental libraries and a well adequate central library for successful running the courses offered. There is also a smart classroom provided with internet facilities and smart board. There is another smart class room cum mini auditorium in the museum building. Many of the classrooms have ICT facilities , where lectures are delivered via overhead projector, and google classrooms are used for effective continuous internal evaluation process. The college has a medicinal plant garden maintained by the department of Botany and own zoological museum of department of zoology. The college has separate Boys and Girls Hostel for providing better accommodations to the outstation students. The college has its own playground for conducting annual sports. The central library has more than 30000 books, more than 60% of which is digitally indexed, and 10 subscribed journals. The college has its own historical museum that contains a good number of archeological statues and objects and manuscripts with immense historical importance. It has separate bio degradable and non bio-degradable waste disposal and waste management system. To maintain and raise awareness of hygiene among girl students the college has installed vending machine for easy acquisition of sanitary napkins. Some science departments are planned to be upgraded to adequate research facilities where proper research work can be done by the students under NEP curriculum.

Average expenditure for inwi-fi internet connections is about Rs70000/- per academic session. Mr. Saikat Ghosh faculty of computer science has been appointed as designated system administrator of Balurghat college, and has successfully maintaining the IT facilities, and working rigorously to upgrade the facilities in the campus. The college upgrades its security system periodically, with proper maintenance and some new installations of CCTV surveillance cameras, and biometric attendance system of the employees.

For bulk purchase tender call is invited and small purchase is done from the local vendor strictly following the government's financial rules. Maintenance of physical facilities: a. Plumbing- Maintenance of the water supply to different departments and laboratories is done on call basis when necessary. c. Ltd. was found. Almost all the teaching and non-teaching staffs are its members. Since its inception, it is taking loans from DakshinDinajpur Central Co-operative Bank and distributing among the members. Besides, the cooperative has been able to generate its own fund by the shares of all members. The Co-operative is successfully running since its inception. It has never seen NPA (Non Performing Assets). For its best performance over the years, Balurghat College has been awarded 'Samabay Ratna' (Cooperative Jewel) by the Govt. of West Bengal in 2018. The female staff members enjoy maternity leave of six months as per Govt. rule. The faculty members are also provided with special leave for availing of fellowships and completing Ph.D thesis. Non-teaching Staffs and State Aided College Teachers enjoy a special health scheme by Govt. of West Bengal named Swasthya Sathi. Maternity leave, child care leaves and other beneficial leaves including study leaves for higher education for faculty members are given to faculty members as per W.B. Govt. service rules.

In the session 2022-23, Balurghat College cooperative society has provided housebuilding loans and small term loans to faculty members. Some faculty members are also benefited through the WBHS (Health Scheme) processed via Balurghat College nodal officer for the same.

IQAC verifies the documents and forward the applications to proper suthority for appraisal and career advancement procedures. Professors undertake various career advancement schemes including seminars, workshops, administrative duties, examination related duties for career advancement. 7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 200 words

Effective curriculum delivery to students of all socioeconomic background and demographics is one area distinctive to priority and thrust of Balurghat College. To implement effective curriculum delivery, college has taken measures to ensure maximum participation of students in regular classes. To make this happen, college authority has come-up with a master mentoring programme plan with direct communication between mentors and mentees. In this large scale mentoring programme, each faculty members are assigned 25-30 students as mentee. Faculty members were provided a list containing phone number and roll number of students. Each mentor faculty member created a whatsapp group, via which they have provided information to the students regarding class routine, registration and form fill up for university examinations, extension of deadlines, modifications in the exam procedure, notices regarding various scholarship schemes etc. The faculty members also conducted face-to-face meetings with the mentee students, atleast twice in a semester, and listened to their problems, and provided solutions to best of ability. A core committee of 3 faculty members were assigned the duty of monitoring the mentoring programme.. They submitted the report periodically to principal of the college after meeting with mentors. IQAC assisted all the stakeholders in the whole process. this programme was initialised during 2021-22 academic session, and during 2022-23 academic session some innovative measures are taken to make the programme more effective. Mentors have organised small career guidance, career counselling programmes for students to increase awareness, and this also helped more in-person contact between mentors and mentees.

The curriculum is set by University of GourBanga. The institute has designed a well planned master routine keeping into account the prescribed format of class distribution required for effective curriculum delivery. The ratio of honours and general courses has been managed according to the requirement of UGC curriculum. The standing committee on academic affairs meet regularly to formulate strategies for effective curriculum delivery, and action taken report is well documented in minutes of these meetings. Internal assessment would carry direct weightage in total marks in CBCS system for each paper. Student feedback system ensures the quality of the effectiveness in curriculum delivery, at the end of the academic year. Regularized class tests and laboratory tests has ensured proper delivery of the curriculum and preparedness of the students during academic session. ICT enabled teaching learning process has enhanced the quality and effectiveness of curriculum delivery. Proper and updated instruments as per requirement of the CBCS curriculum are provided to the students. Alongside student feedback, other modes of effective curriculum delivery is documented as completion of class loads as per routine, and well documented by IQAC. Experiential learning and project works are implemented as part of curriculum delivery to ensure outcome based teaching.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

After periodic evaluation of the first year (HONS) students, 2 months after their admission, two categories of students are found-advanced and slow learners, depending on their basic knowledge and performance in these evaluations. As most of the students are first generation learners, College use to give special emphasis on their learning process and adaptability to the academic environment. To match up their compatibility different kinds of methods like mock teaching, remedial classes, group discussions, interactive practical sessions, advanced learning by systematic seminars etc. are organized. For example, in mock teaching the advanced learners are asked to convey lectures on some particular topics and the slow learners are asked to upgrade their knowledge via interactive session after completion of the lecture. College actively appreciate the advanced learners by providing them various reference books and encourage them to share their understanding and concepts with their classmates in the form of reverse classroom. To develop interest and confidence among students about the subject, quiz and group discussions are arranged choosing various topics from syllabus. E contents like ppt, flashcard, YouTube study videos and online animation are used to clear the doubts of the students whenever necessary. As most of the students come from Bengali medium schools, many of them face difficulties to follow English books and lectures. In remedial classes college try to provide study materials in Bengali to students so that they can quickly the concept.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Different department of Balurghat college arranges various student centric programmes that enable students to develop self confidence and rectify their mistakes. There has been a paradigm shift in classroom teaching over last two years, and various Departments use outcome based teaching where they engage students in all research projects, application based assignments. Students are often given tasks correlating their knowledge to real life scenarios. Small research papers, or assignments are given in such a way so that the students have to collect information from newspapers, internet, and real life work environment.. Annual exhibition held regularly in the college premises and students are encouraged to perform different project works with socio-economical values and scientific outcomes. The topics were demonstrated by all the students using different charts, models and practical demonstration. Faculty members of various departments conduct debates and discussions where students are encouraged to come with different opinions and thoughts which pave the way of arguments as well as away of learning. In most of the classes topics are discussed briefly and problem solving methodology is used to check their understanding about the topic. In the practical classes the apparatus and instruments are used individually so that they can acquire the knowledge of handling these by themselves. The students regularly participate in the Youth Parliament Competitions . Various cultural and academic competitions are also organized by which the students get the scope of participative learning. Along with exhibition, some departments organize educational and industrial visit in the nearby areas. The students get the opportunity to have a hands-on learning experience from the experts of the field of manufacturing industries.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

College has multiplededicated smart class rooms (one smart room including smart board), and a mini conference hall with ICT facilities. The college has 5 portable overhead projector and 2 built-in overhead projector in Smart room and dept of bengali. Faculty members use these ICT tools to teach various topics that need ausio-visual demonstration for effective curriculum delivery. All the departments have their individual whatsapp groups where communication is made regarding electronic version of studymaterials, including video lectures, links to project work, assignment etc. All the general students are also enrolled in official whatsapp and telegram groups via which effective communication is established and study materials are supplied regarding teaching-learning process. Each faculty member is assigned atleast one class per week in ICT enabled classrooms, and a logbook of ICT rooms attendance is maintained. Central library has inbuilt KOHA software system for digitised check-in, check out of books. Abou 50% of 30000+ books in library has been enlisted under digital automation.

Faculty members also use google classrooms for home assignments and tests. Most of the departments periodically conduct ICT skill training for their students, so that students are well equipped about various ICT based academic aids.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

CBCS currucilum of University of GourBanga includes 20% of total marks for internal assessment in each paper for laboratory based subjects, and 36% for non lab based subjects. All the departments has definite mechanism for continuous internal evaluation via class tests, unit tests, mock teaching, experiential lerning like project work, field excursions, performance arts and display of creative ideas. Class tests are conducted atleast once for each paper during the semester in each course. Copies of class tests are evaluated and distributed among the students , and answers are discussed in doubt clearing classes. Tutorials are conducted after assessing advance and slow learners in each class. Assignments are given on topics that need special discussion and attention, and students are assessed in the tutorial class based on assignments and tests. Some departments and courses demand submission of project work, through which students are also evaluated. Attendance to classess constitute 40% of the assigned internal assessment for each paper. Minimum 75% of attendance are required for each student to be evaluated for each course/paper. Stress has been given on continuous internal evaluation process. Project work are given to the students which are integral part of internal evaluation process.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Balurghat College offers undergraduate programme in 20 subjects (16 hons) and PG programme in 3 subjects. PG division of Balurghat College is autonomous. The institute has adequate infrastructural facilities like 35 Classrooms, 18 laboratories, computer laboratories, departmental libraries and a well adequate central library for successful running the courses offered. There is also a smart classroom provided with internet facilities and smart board. There is another smart class room cum mini auditorium in the museum building. Many of the classrooms have ICT facilities, where lectures are delivered via overhead projector, and google classrooms are used for effective continuous internal evaluation process. The college has a

medicinal plant garden maintained by the department of Botany and own zoological museum of department of zoology. The college has separate Boys and Girls Hostel for providing better accommodations to the outstation students. The college has its own playground for conducting annual sports. The central library has more than 30000 books, more than 60% of which is digitally indexed, and 10 subscribed journals. The college has its own historical museum that contains a good number of archeological statues and objects and manuscripts with immense historical importance. It has separate bio degradable and non bio-degradable waste disposal and waste management system. To maintain and raise awareness of hygiene among girl students the college has installed vending machine for easy acquisition of sanitary napkins. Some science departments are planned to be upgraded to adequate research facilities where proper research work can be done by the students under NEP curriculum.

1. Maintenance of academic facilities- HoDs of respective departments place the requisitions for all academic requirements like reference books and journals, organizing special seminars, lectures, laboratory equipments and chemicals, developing study materials, or workshops, in writing mentioning the approximate budget. The requisitions are placed in the meeting of the governing body, finance committee, library committee or any other relevant committee. For bulk purchase tender call is invited and small purchase is done from the local vendor strictly following the government's financial rules. Maintenance of physical facilities:

a. Carpentry- The wooden furnitures like benches and desks of class and office rooms are well maintained and repaired by local vendors.

b. Plumbing- Maintenance of the water supply to different departments and laboratories is done on call basis when necessary.

c. Civil works- The physical status of building is regularly monitored by appropriate authority. All repairworks of the building are also done through appropriate tender.

d. Gardening: The medicinal plant garden is maintained by the department of Botany. The other gardens are maintained by the students of the NSS and NCC units.

e. Campus and classroom cleaning: There are 2 appointed permanent sweepers for regular cleaning.

f. IT infrastructure: For the maintenance of the IT infrastructure (Wi-Fi, computers etc) the college has appointed local vendors named Office Solutions, Balurghat.

g. Electricity: A permanent electrician cum care taker takes care of electric lines and wares as well as electrical goods. The college also has separate generator room to provide continuous power supply

The Governing Body is the apex body of the institution is formed as per the statute of the University of Gour Banga. Principal of the college is the Secretary of the Governing Body. President of the Governing Body is selected by the Government of West Bengal. Policy matters and all important decisions are taken by the Governing Body regarding academic and administrative affairs. 6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 - The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non- teaching staff

In 1987, Balurghat College Employees co-operative Credit Society Ltd. was found. Almost all the teaching and non-teaching staffs are its members. Since its inception, it is taking loans from DakshinDinajpur Central Co-operative Bank and distributing among the members. Besides, the cooperative has been abled to generate its own fund by the shares of all members. The Co-operative is successfully running since its inception. It has never seen NPA (Non Performing Assets). For its best performance over the years, Balurghat College has been awarded 'Samabay Ratna' (Cooperative Jewel) by the Govt. of West Bengal in 2018. The female staff members enjoy maternity leave of six months as per Govt. rule. The faculty members are also provided with special leave for availing of fellowships and completing Ph.D thesis. Non-teaching Staffs and State Aided College Teachers enjoy a special health scheme by Govt. of West Bengal named Swasthya Sathi. Maternity leave, child care leaves and other beneficial leaves including study leaves for higher education for faculty members are given to faculty members as per W.B. Govt. service rules.

In the session 2022-23 , Balurghat College cooperative society has provided housebuilding loans and small term loans to faculty members . Some faculty members are also benifited through the WBHS (Health Scheme) processed via Balurghat College nodal officer for the same.

API score and career advancement is done according to latest UGC Guidelines, in collaboration with Dept. of Higher Education, Govt of Westbengal. IQAC verifies the documents and forward the applications to proper suthority for appraisal and career advancement procedures. Professors undertake various career advancement schemes including seminars, workshops, administrative duties, examination related duties for career advancement. 7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 200 words

Effective curriculum delivery to students of all socioeconomic background and demographics is one area distinctive to priority and thrust of Balurghat College. To implement effective curriculum delivery, college has taken measures to ensure maximum participation of students in regular classes. To make this happen, college authority has come-up with a master mentoring programme plan with direct communication between mentors and mentees. In this large scale mentoring programme, each faculty members are assigned 25-30 students as mentee. Faculty members were provided a list containing phone number and roll number of students. Each mentor faculty member created a whatsapp group, via which they have provided information to the students regarding class routine, registration and form fill up for university examinations, extension of deadlines, modifications in the exam procedure, notices regarding various scholarship schemes etc. The faculty members also conducted face-to-face meetings with the mentee students, atleast twice in a semester, and listened to their problems, and provided solutions to best of ability. A core committee of 3 faculty members were assigned the

duty of monitoring the mentoring programme.. They submitted the report periodically to principal of the college after meeting with mentors. IQAC assisted all the stakeholders in the whole process. this programme was initialised during 2021-22 academic session, and during 2022-23 academic session some innovative measures are taken to make the programme more effective. Menotrs have organised small career guidance, career counselling programmes for students to increase awareness, and this also helped more in-person contact between mentors and mentees.
